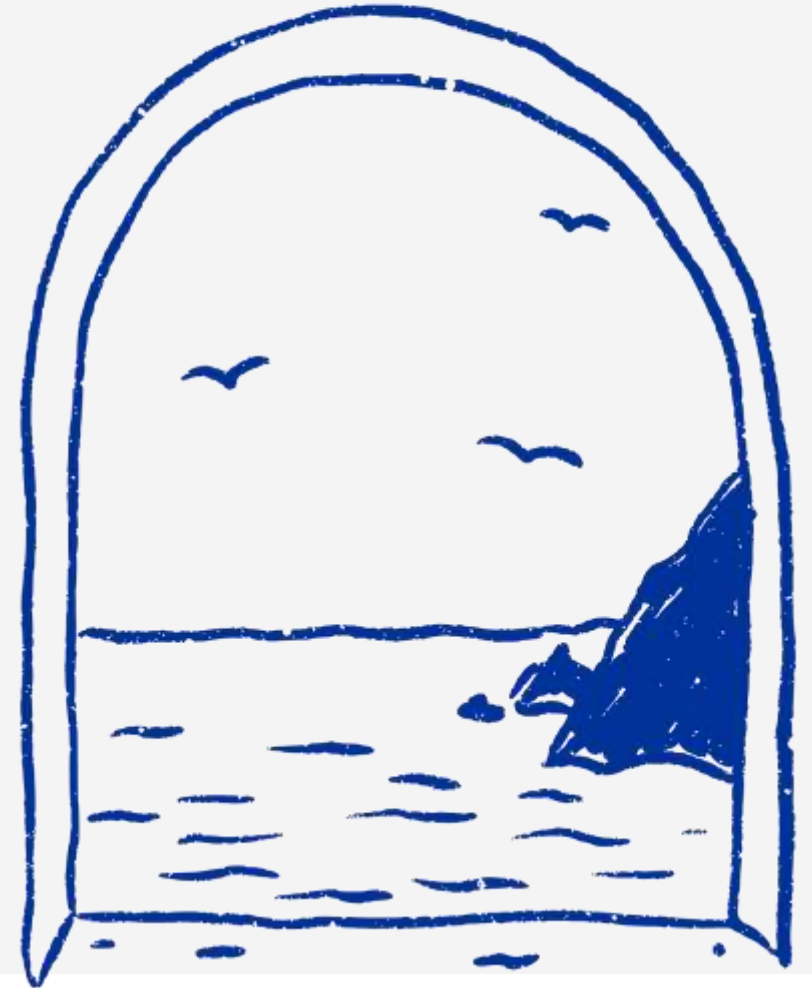

Core Objective

Capitalisation projects under the MMM must:



Reuse Existing Outputs

Use of the joint MMM database is compulsory. Projects must build on outputs already produced within the MMM ecosystem.



Transfer to New Areas

Outputs must be transferred to new territories and stakeholders, extending their reach beyond the original context.



Scale Their Impact

Projects must demonstrate a credible pathway to scaling impact across the broader Mediterranean cooperation area.

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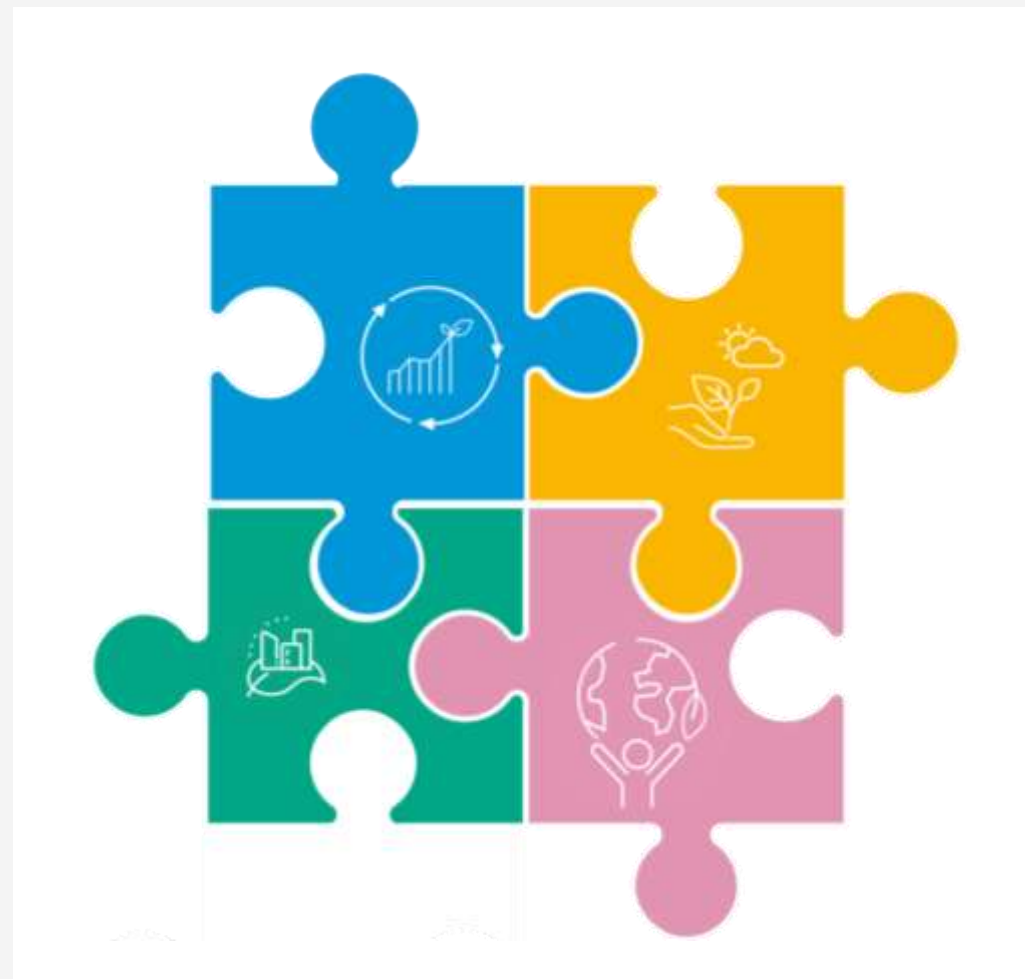

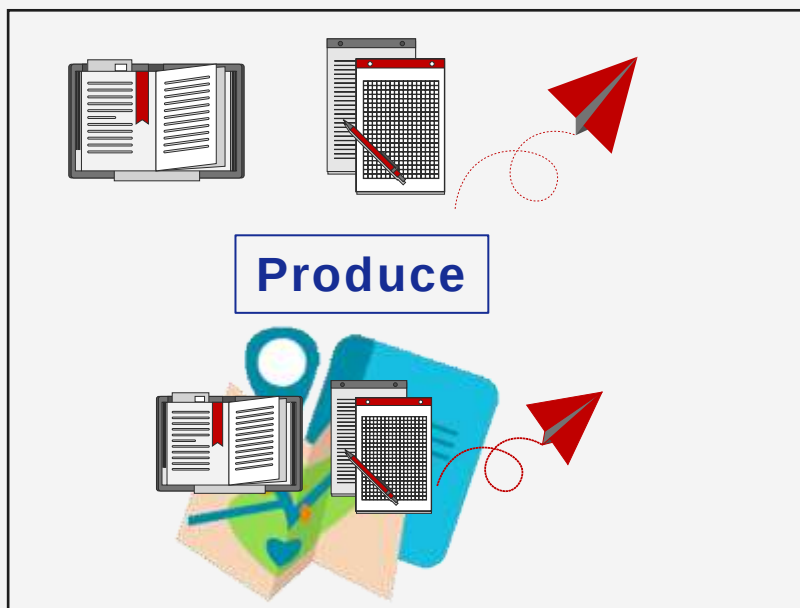

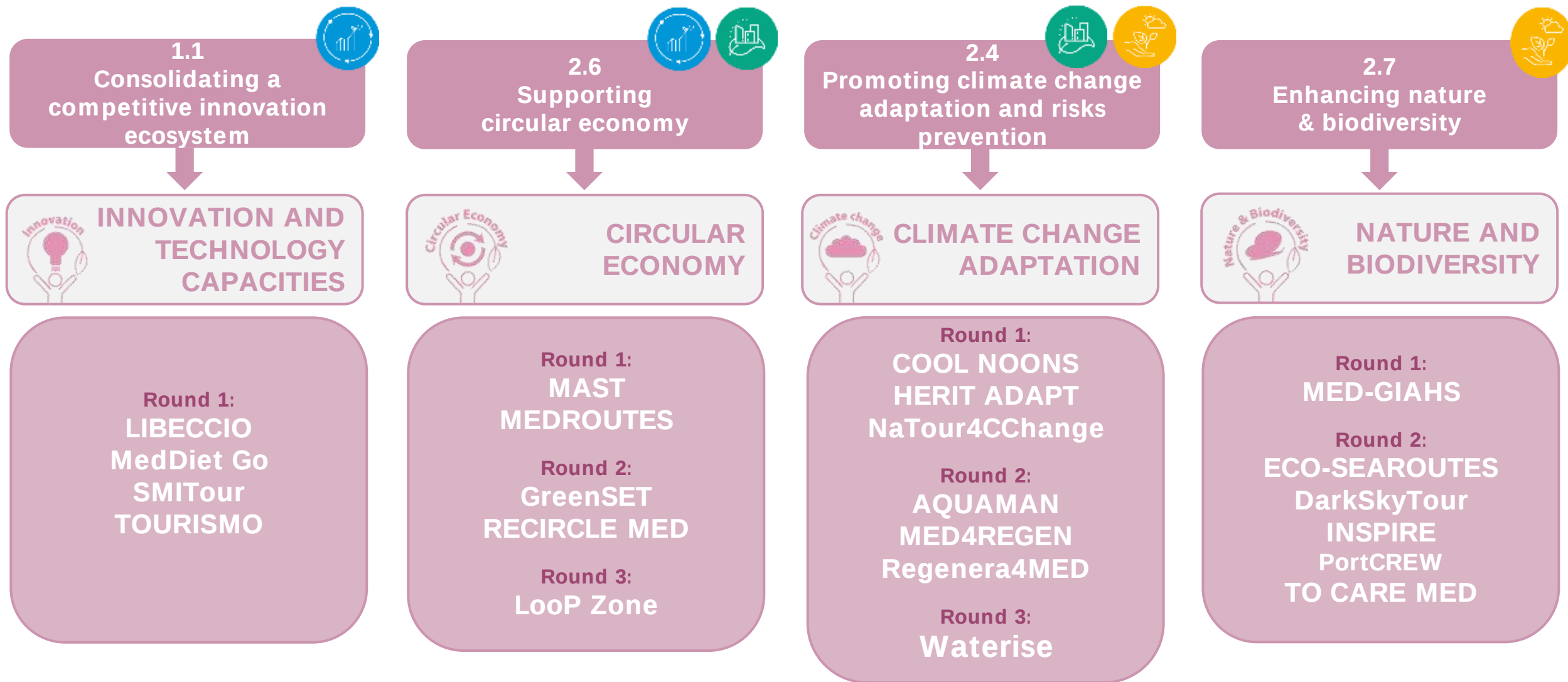

Thematic developments and policy uptakes

- **Database:** provide relevant information to feed the databases developed
- **Working groups:** participate in clustering process, development of synergies, collective thematic work (surveys, review of documents, provision of examples, etc.)
- **Networking activities** (in addition to mandatory joint event): participate in events for collective dissemination, transferring and integration processes
- **Joint capacity building activities:** participate in content development and or participate in training/mentoring/support processes offered by TCP
- **Transferring potential:** provide information to enable proper analysis of replicability, transferability and integration potential of project results
- **Mainstream support:** share previous experiences and mainstream methodologies

Compulsory activities:

Contributing to the Euro-MED Academy : Training and Library

The [Library](#) gather most relevant **key deliverables and outputs with the best transferability potential**.

Their publication is subjected to a peer review process carried out by governance projects.

The [Training platform](#) is now available. As part of their transfer phase, projects are invited to consider the **compatibility of the trainings developed with the Academy** to ensure greater impact (availability, visibility).

=> The procedure, guidelines and template for submission to the pedagogical committee are available in each basecamp mission. Its integration should be anticipated by projects in their workplan.

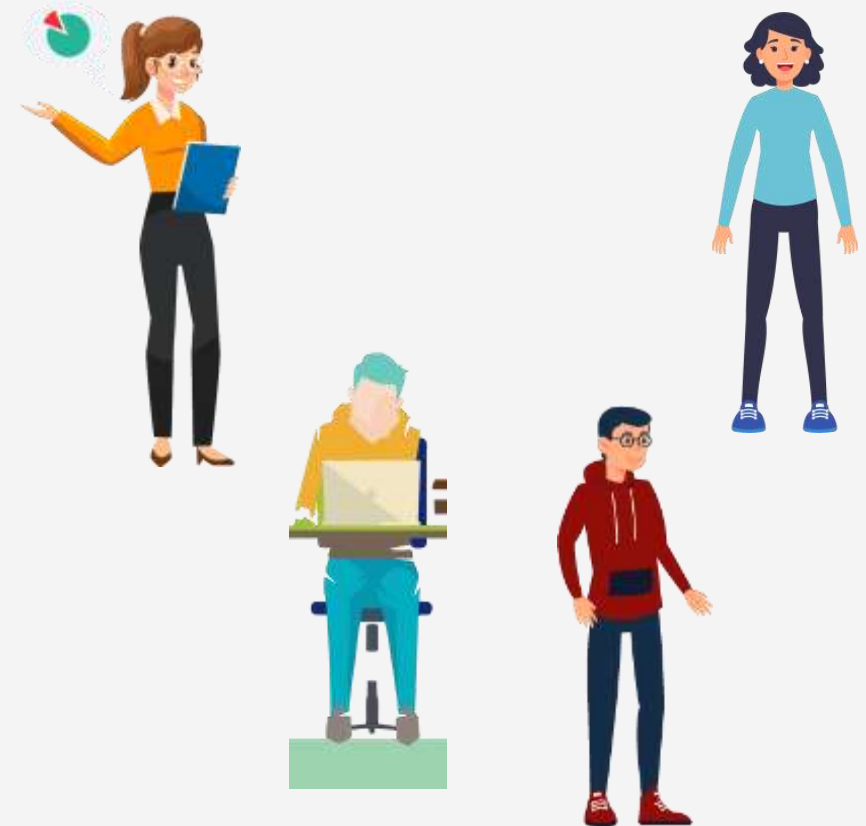

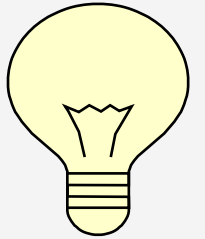

What Makes a Strong MMM Project?

- 1 Clear identified output coming from another MMM programme
- 2 Credible transfer and adaptation strategy
- 3 Strong partnership enabling uptake
- 4 Explicit link to policies and territorial needs
- 5 Built-in cooperation and knowledge exchange approach

Good things to do



- ✓ Read carefully the **Programme Manual** and the specific **ToR**
- ✓ Use the « **list of administrative and eligibility criteria** » and the **specificities** of the call to check your proposal
- ✓ Double check all documents uploaded and their content
- ✓ Follow our thematic and technical seminars

Top Mistakes to Avoid

⊗ Avoid these common pitfalls when designing your MMM capitalisation project.

⊗ Starting from Scratch

Designing a project without a clear existing output to build upon defeats the purpose of capitalisation.

⊗ Single Programme Logic

Staying within one programme's logic with no transfer dimension misses the core MMM requirement.

⊗ Vague Transfer Plans

A weak explanation of how transfer will concretely happen undermines the credibility of the entire application.

⊗ No Added Value Evidence

Failing to demonstrate added value in the new territory leaves evaluators unconvinced of the project's merit.

⊗ Optional Synergies

Treating synergies as optional rather than central to the project design is a fundamental misunderstanding of the call.

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Application procedure

- ✓ **APPLICATION FORM** to be filled-in in Jems (English or French) and submitted
- ✓ **MANDATORY ANNEXES** : partners (incl. LP) and associated partners declaration generated from the Jems system and signed

Two consecutive stages:

1. **Application Form**, to be **validated in Jems before 30/09/2026**, at 13.00 (Brussels time)
2. **Mandatory annexes**:, to be **uploaded in Jems before 14/10/2026** at 13.00 (Brussels time).

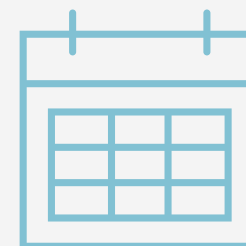

Mediterranean Multiprogramme Mechanism coordinated call

This **7th call for projects** is launched by the Interreg Euro-MED Programme under the **Mediterranean Multiprogramme Mechanism**, a strategic framework to strengthen cooperation on **sustainable tourism** among Interreg Programmes. This initiative now brings together ten Interreg Programmes, eight of which are part of this coordinated call.

This call reflects a shared commitment among the participating Interreg Programmes to transforming tourism into a driver for inclusive growth, climate resilience, and territorial cohesion across the Mediterranean, mitigating environmental degradation and ensuring equitable benefits for local communities.

It is important to underline that this is a **coordinated call**, not a joint one, as each Programme retains its own rules, budget and selection procedures. Despite the MMM coordination and common framework, each Programme will manage all formal steps of the call separately.

Potential beneficiaries must therefore apply to a single Interreg MMM Programme participating in this coordinated call.

Applying to the call

The **Terms of reference** set out the specific criteria expected for this coordinated call.

This 7th call for proposals will be carried out in a single application phase. Applications are possible only during the **dates of the call** (see calendar below). Outside this period, no application will be considered.

Applications must be submitted online via Jems, the monitoring system developed by Interact. It is available for all applicants and partners at: <https://jems.interreg-euro-med.eu/>. To help you use Jems, you can read the [user manual](#).

The Programme's Monitoring Committee decides which projects to approve.

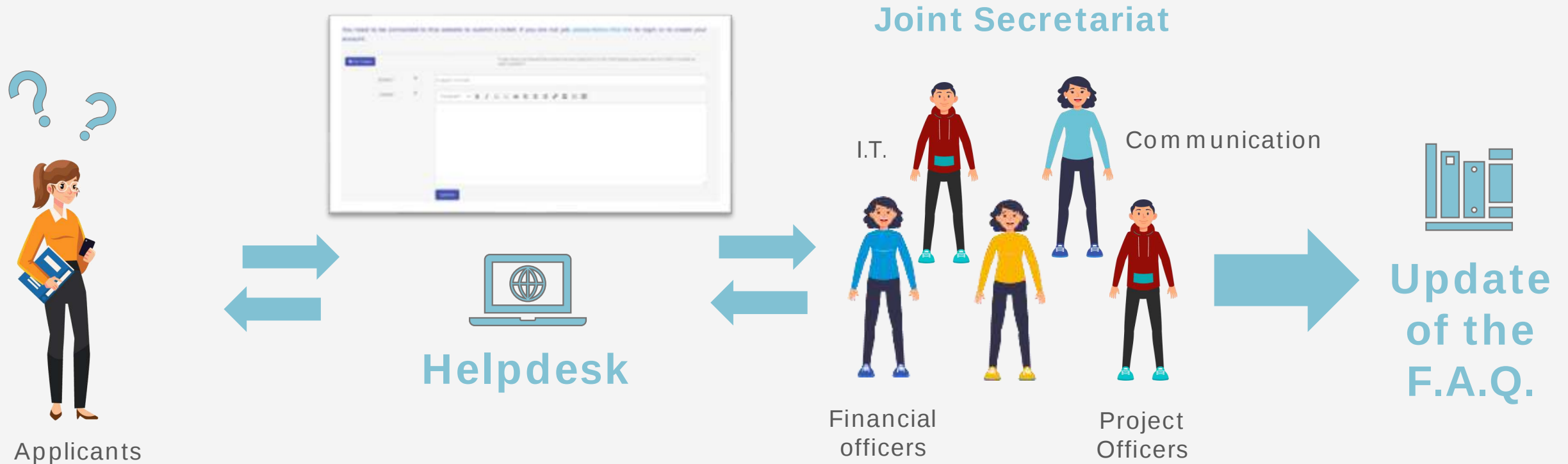
